

Belmont Neighbourhood Centre is officially opening their children's play area after recent upgrades. The centre was successful in receiving Community Building Partnership funds of \$10,000 which was used to install new children's play equipment.

'It is a much needed improvement to our beloved centre, and the kids are thrilled to have new equipment', said Chris Brown, Centre Coordinator.

This upgrade of new play equipment was made possible with funding of \$10,000 from the Community Building Partnership program. The program awards grants to deliver positive social, environment and recreational outcomes for the community.

After consulting with local community and playgroups, 10 items of play equipment have been installed to help develop balance and coordination. 'We installed ten smaller play items, rather than one big one, so that children could spread out across the playground', said Brown.

Play equipment was selected with children on the Autism spectrum in mind. 'Every Thursday we have a supported playgroup for children on the autism spectrum, or kids who need extra behavioural support. Selecting equipment which would give them a range of sensory stimulation and feedback was really important to the project', said Brown.

The Belmont Neighbourhood Centre is a community run, not for profit organisation which provides services and support to the people of Belmont area and beyond, through children's playgroups, providing information and advocacy, volunteer opportunities, free computer access and a range of wellbeing services.

'The children are not the only ones who benefit from this new equipment. The parents do too, as they connect with other parents from the area, learn and support each other', said Brown.

The official launch is Monday 5th march, at Belmont Neighbourhood Centre, 359 Pacific Highway, Belmont North.



SAFE TALK

Would you like to gain skills on how to support others in the community to address the issue of suicide?

Do you want to be part of a strong supportive community?

If we have 10 people interested in attending, this can be run at no cost, right here in Windale. When you register your interest, mention attending the Windale workshop.

SafeTALK is a 3.5 hour alertness workshop that prepares anyone, regardless of prior experience or training, to become a suicide-alert helper. SafeTALK-trained helpers can recognise when someone needs help and can take action by connecting the person with thoughts of suicide to life-saving intervention resources, such as caregivers trained in ASIST.

Workshop features:

- Minimum 10 maximum 30 people per session.
- Presentations and guidance from a LivingWorks registered trainer.
- Hands-on skills, practice, and development.
- Access to support from a local community resource person.
- The simple yet effective TALK steps: Tell, Ask, Listen, and KeepSafe.

Content and discussion on suicide prevention is delivered in the SafeTALK workshop and even though this is within an educational, skills based framework it could be triggering for some people who have a lived experience or have been touched by suicide in some way. It is recommended that if the experience is recent or if discussion of suicide is difficult, it is a good idea to contact the training facilitator prior to undertaking the workshop and discuss some possible options for further information and support. A community resource support person is also available during the session, and this person is someone that an organisation or community group can identify and invite along or I can invite one of my contacts along. The support person is there in case someone does leave the room and is feeling affected by the training.

SafeTALK doesn't cover any local cases, individual experiences, or suicide methodology (how people have died/injured themselves), it isn't a therapy session and we don't ask people to disclose any personal information. We definitely don't unpack the ethics of suicide.

This training is also free-of-charge for those living or working in the Lake Macquarie region, it is been funded by the NSW Ministry of Health until June 2020.

Matt says, "You need to have something to look forward to, it doesn't have to be cricket, so any sport will do."


